The contributions must be original and should not be under consideration for any other publication at the same time.

All accepted papers go through rigorous peer reviews.

Papers that clear the peer reviews will be presented at the conference, after which it will be selected for publication in an edited volume on **Equal Opportunity & Gender Diversity** to be brought out by CDPP at the end of the year.

Last date for submission is 28 September, 2020 (Monday).

Manuscript Submission Guidelines for Conference Papers

AUTHORSHIP

- All parties who have contributed to the article must be listed as authors. Principal
 authorship, authorship order, and other publication credits should be based on the
 relative scientific or professional contributions of the individuals involved, regardless
 of their status. A student is usually listed as principal author on any multipleauthored publication that substantially derives from the student's work.
- *Please ensure you all required permission* from copyright holders for reproducing any illustrations, tables, figures or lengthy quotations previously published elsewhere.

SUBMISSION FORMAT

- Contributors must provide their affiliations and complete postal and e-mail addresses with their articles.
- All articles should be double-spaced throughout (not only the text but also displayed quotations, notes, references and any other matter).
- Contributions should be in MS Word format.
- All articles must be accompanied by 4–6 keywords and an abstract of 150–200 words.
- Notes should be numbered serially and presented at the end of the article. Notes must contain more than a mere reference.
- British spellings throughout; universal 's' in '-ise', '-isation' words.
- Use single quotes throughout. Double quotes only to be used within single quotes.
 Spellings of words in quotations should not be changed. Quotations of 45 words or more should be separated from the text and indented with one space with a line space above and below.
- Use '19th century', '1980s'. Spell out numbers from one to nine, 10 and above to remain in figures. However, for exact measurements, use only figures (3 km, 9 per cent, not %).
- Use thousands and millions, not lakhs and crores.
- Avoid saying 'recently' but rather give the year.
- There is no limit on the number of references allowed.
- We adhere to the APA reference style.
